GOOD NIGHT OR GOOD BYE?



Dr. Langdale of New York tells of a Christian businessman who was hit by a car and rushed to the hospital. **He was told he had only two hours to live.** Calling his family together, he spoke to each in turn. “Good night dear wife. Through sunshine and shadow we have walked together. You have been my inspiration in everything I have undertaken. Many times I have seen the Spirit of God shining in your face. I love you far more than the day you became my bride. Good night, dear; I will see you in the morning; good night.”

“Good night, Mary. You are our firstborn. What a joy you have been to your father. What a Christian you are, Mary; you will never forget how your father loved you. Good night, Mary, good night.”

He turned to his oldest son. “Good night, Will. Your coming into our home has been an unmixed blessing. You love the God of your father. You will continue to grow in every Christian grace and virtue. You have your father's love and blessing. Good night, Will, good night.”

Charles was next in line. He had gotten into bad company and bitterly disappointed his father and mother. The dying man skipped him and spoke to the youngest child, a beautiful young girl.

“Gracie, you have long been a song of gladness, a ray of light. When not long ago you surrendered your life to Christ, my cup of happiness was full to overflowing. Good night, little girl, good night.”

“Good-bye, Charlie.” **He then called Charlie to his side.** “Charlie, what a fine, promising boy you were. Your father and mother believed that you would develop into a noble man. We gave you all the opportunities we gave to the other children. If there has been any difference, you yourself must admit that difference was all in your own favour. You have disappointed us. You have followed the broad and downward road. You have not heeded the warnings of God’s holy Word. You have not listened to the call of the Saviour. But I have always loved you and love you still, Charlie. God only knows how much I love you. Good-bye, Charlie, good-bye, good-bye.” Charlie seized his father’s hand and between sobs he cried out **“Father, why have you said good night to the others and good-bye to me?”** His father responded: “For the simple reason that I will meet the other members of the family ‘in the morning’ but by all the promises that assure us of a reunion, by those same statements of God’s word I can have no hope of seeing you ‘over there’. Good-bye, Charlie, good-bye.”

Charlie fell on his knees by his dying father’s bed and cried out in agony of his soul, praying God to forgive his sins.

“Do you mean it, Charlie? Are you in earnest?”

“God knows I am,” said the heartbroken young man.

“Then God will hear you and save you, Charlie, and it is good night and not good-bye. Good night, Charlie, good night, my boy.” And he was gone.

Dear friend, when you will be leaving this world, will it be good night or good-bye for you? It will be good-bye for you, if you don’t respond positively to God who created you and loves you beyond measure (John 3:16; Jeremiah 31:3). God has made every necessary arrangement to beautify your life through the death and resurrection of His Son, Jesus Christ, on the cross of Calvary. Jesus Christ will give you eternal life, if you will accept Him into your life as your personal Lord and Saviour. The choice is yours to make because God has set before you, life and death, blessing and cursing (Deuteronomy 30:19) but He is advising you to choose life so that all will be well with you. Jesus said “I am the way, the truth, and the Life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me” (John 14:6). You can choose life by surrendering your life to Jesus Christ today. Pray this simple prayer now to surrender your life to the Lordship of Jesus:

"Lord Jesus, I know that I am a sinner and I cannot save myself. Please, come into my heart and forgive me my sins. Please, write my name in the book of life. I believe you are the Son of God who died and rose again from the death because of me. I confess you as my personal Lord and Saviour. From this day I promise to serve you in holiness and righteousness all the days of my life. Please, fill my heart with the joy of your salvation. Thank you for hearing me. In the name of Jesus, I pray. Amen"
